Rights Ambassadors Visit to St Julie's

On Monday 27th November a group of our Rights Ambassadors were invited to visit St Julie's High School in Woolton. The purpose of the visit was to have a demonstration on designing and making badges and to create our very own Rights Ambassador Badge.

Twelve members of our RRS Team, accompanied by Mrs Maclean and Mrs Kelly our Governor, arrived at St Julie's to be given a warm reception by Mrs Middleman and Mr Radburn, who then showed everyone into the Arts Block where the IT design lab was situated.

Mr Radburn explained how they would use a computer software program to create the format of the badge. They were able to see on screen their ideas take shape and everyone was eager to see the finished product. While this part of the lesson was taking place Mr Alderman, the Headteacher of St Julie's, popped in to say hello. He was very interested in, and impressed by, our involvement in RRS and told us that he was planning for his school to also become involved in the not too distant future.

Finally, once everybody was happy with their finished design, they were printed out and the next stage of the process began. This involved cutting out the printed paper discs and putting the badge together. Once this was completed they were laid out and we all had a vote as to which one should be chosen as our official Rights Ambassador badge.
