On Thursday, we enjoyed a music concert from Rocksteady. We enjoyed learning how the bass guitar, keyboard and drums can be played and we loved singing along to some familiar songs. ## YEAR FOUR:

This week Year 4 have been working hard, finishing off our final few lessons of the year. In Maths, we have learned all about position and direction, moving shapes across the X and Y axis. On Thursday we put our skills to the test as we created famous cartoon images using co-ordinates and squared paper. In English we have been debating current topics and building up our vocabulary when arguing for and against these issues.

Finally in RE, we have got to the end of our final topic of God's People. We have looked at the impact that special people can have on the world by following in God's way.
