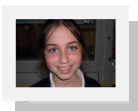
Did you Know ?

The United Nations and Pope Francis are trying to get the same message out there. **Article 24** states that children should get safe water and nutritious food as well as a clean safe environment . These are similar to the **Corporal Works Of Mercy** , which were declared by Pope Francis. It is our duty to feed the hungry, give drinks to the thirsty and shelter the homeless.

Both Pope Francis and **Article 22** talk about the refugee crisis. **All children have these rights wherever they are.** These are basic needs that everyone is entitled to so, as a world wide committee, we need to work together to provide these to the people who need it most.
