WHAT'S BEEN HAPPENING IN SCHOOL THIS WEEK?

EYFS:

We have had a lovely week this week as we have continued learning about holidays, and luckily we have had some lovely sunny weather this week too! We have loved looking at all your holiday pictures, and we have tried to find those destinations on our world maps. We have also looked closely at the environment in the pictures, and compared to what Liverpool is like, talking about similarities and differences. In busy the time, the children have been learning about writing postcards, and have created their own beach scene. The children have also really enjoyed playing in our beach role play area, and playing in the water tray outside to help us stay cool! In Maths we have been recapping odd and even numbers, and journaling what we have learnt! In RE this week we have been carrying on learning about Friendship, and have written a prayer to thank Jesus for being our friend. Thank you to everyone who sent hats in this week to protect the children from the sun. We hope you all have a great weekend, from the Reception Team.

YEAR ONE:

It has been a busy week in Year 1! In English we started a new story, No-Bot. The children recalled the events of the story brilliantly. They then used their innovation skills to write about another object Bernard the robot could mistake for his missing bottom. We also explored how to use speech marks and the children explored using them to write dialog to match the innovated part of the story.

The children built incredible bug hotels in DT this week. We hope you have found a good place to keep them at home so all the bugs can have a safe place to live.

In Maths, the children reviewed their knowledge of numbers up to 100, recognising, comparing and ordering.

We also did Computing this week. The children learnt about digital writing and used laptops to type their names on Word Processor. This was very tricky but we all helped each other very well.

We started a new Art project this week. The children learnt about the artist Michelle Reeder, and how she used every-day recycled objects to create sculptures. This will be great inspiration for their own art next week.

YEAR TWO:

We have had a fantastic week of learning this week! On Monday, we discussed God's rules and how it is important to make sure we follow his rules to make ourselves and others happy. We talked about the difficulties we can feel particularly when we forgive others. In History, we have been learning all about the Promenade. We looked at the attractions which used to bring crowds of Victorians to the seaside and wrote a postcard home in the role of a Victorian child. In English, we have been sequencing and retelling our version of Flotsam, we then used this to recreate our very own beginning, middle and end of the story. In Maths, we have been learning the names and properties of 3D shapes. We then made nets of the 3D shapes; cubes, cuboids, cones, prisms and pyramids. Finally, in Science we have been exploring the properties of materials.

YEAR THREE:

This week in Year 3, we began a new unit in maths- Perimeter. The children have learnt that this is the total length around a shape and enjoyed finding out the perimeter of different objects around the class! In Tuesday's geography lesson, the focus was on the Lake District and it was lovely to see how much knowledge some of the children already had on the area. Through using maps, both classes were able to identify some of the physical features of the Lake District and began to look at the human aspects how tourism affects its economy. On Wednesday, we continued learning about plants, which saw the children set up their own investigation. They were given the question 'How does sunlight affect plant health?' and decided on two ways in which they would modify their plants (removing half of the leaves and covering the whole plant). It will be interesting to observe what happens as the days go by! In R.E., the focus was on the Sacrament of Reconciliation, where the children produced information flyers about examining our conscience and how God will always forgive us if we are truly sorry. The highlight of the week came on Friday morning, with the KS2 viewing of the Year 6 performance *Porridge*, which the children thoroughly enjoyed!

YEAR FOUR:

Year 4 pupils returned on Monday, still glowing after their exciting weekend of making their first Holy Communion. They were all eager to share stories about their special day and what they had been up to after leaving church. Afterwards, we headed off on the bus for the resumption of our swimming lessons.

In English, we have been continuing our work on Folk Tales, focusing on the traditional American tales of the trickster, Brer Rabbit. After planning their own stories, children have been writing a paragraph a day as a guided activity. Next week, they will have the opportunity to plan and write their original Brer Rabbit story.

On Thursday, Year 4 pupils studied sound by creating their own string telephones. They learnt that sound travels better through solids than gases which was why we could hear each other whispering through the telephones.

In maths, we have been studying perimeter, area and we are now looking at angles. We recapped what an acute angle, right angle and obtuse angle are before comparing angles, ordering them from smallest to largest.

YEAR FIVE:

It has been another busy week in Year 5. In RE the children looked at the Beatitudes and wrote their own versions. In English, the children continued to write their balanced arguments linked to, 'Is too much screen time making children lazy?' The year group finished their measurements chapter in Maths and have moved on to focusing on area and perimeter.

YEAR SIX:

This week, year 6 have been very busy practising and performing our end of year play! KS1 were invited to watch the performance on Thursday and KS2 Friday. Everybody thoroughly enjoyed it and we have had lots of compliments across the school. All of the children have worked extremely hard and cannot wait for their parents to have the opportunity to watch the play next week. Year 6 also began a new History topic, 'What makes Liverpool unique?' We have looked at events that have changed the city and its occupants. This week, we focused on the Hillsborough disaster. The children were extremely mindful and understanding of what took place and developed interesting and thoughtful debates. They are looking forward to learning more about this great city and its history! We have lots of exciting things happening in our final weeks before Y6 say goodbye to St. Paschal Baylon!
