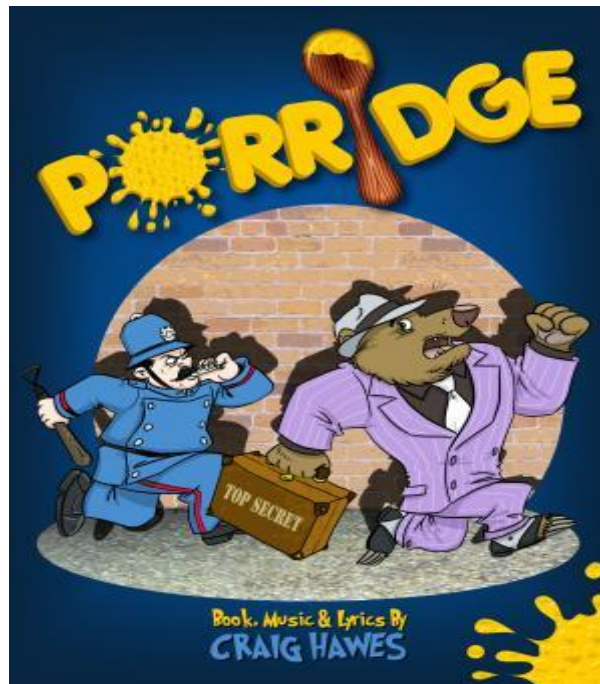

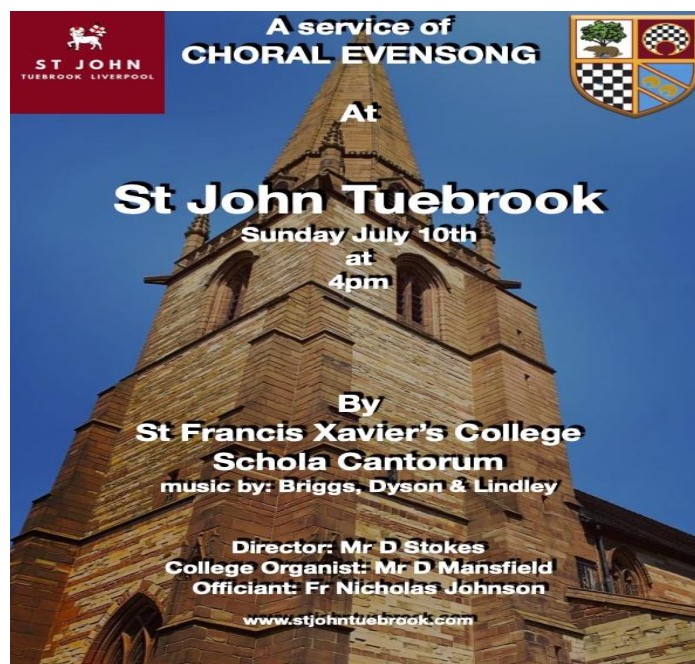

WHAT'S BEEN HAPPENING IN SCHOOL THIS WEEK?

EYFS:

Wow! We have had such a busy week this week. We would like to say a huge thank you to all the children, as they behaved wonderfully on our trip to Farmer Ted's and made us all feel so proud. We had a fantastic day watching the sheep show, petting the guinea pigs, learning all about the reptiles and having fun on toboggans, jumping pillows and play area. We have also been busy this week practicing for our end of year assembly, and we can't wait for you to see it! We have been learning about rainforests during our topic time, and the children have learnt all about different animals who live in the rainforests. We have started making wonderful Frog art, and the children will continue these next week. We will be carrying this on next week as we have had lots of time out of class this week! In RE, we have finished our topic on reconciliation, and the children enjoyed joining in with our collective worship. We hope you all have a great weekend, from the Reception Team.

YEAR ONE:

We have been super busy in Year 1 this week.

In Maths this week we started a new topic; Time. We explored recognising o'clock and half past times on analogue clocks.

We also started a new topic in History; Heroes! We discussed what makes a person a hero, and who is a hero in real life. The children then learnt about a local hero, Kitty Wilkinson. And how she saved many lives during the Cholera Epidemic, by teaching them to wash the germs off their clothes.

In Art, we have researched and designed Junk Model Robots, inspired by Michelle Reeder's sculptures. We are super excited to make these next week!

In R.E. we learnt about Neighbours; who is a neighbour and what makes a person a good neighbour. The children listened to King David's Psalm about neighbours and how we all share the same earth, sky and sun.

The children loved Computing this week, they learnt about algorithms and how to use them to move a robot or program on a tablet.

YEAR TWO:

We started off the week learning all about Reconciliation and the importance of knowing how and when we can say sorry. We also discussed forgiveness and how we can learn from God to always try and forgive even when it is difficult. In Science, we looked at the properties of materials and tested different objects to see if they were flexible, stretchy, malleable or solid. in a woodland habitat. In English, we have been comparing and contrasting three seaside poems. We have looked at alliteration, repetition and similes which can add effect for the reader. Following a structure, we were able to plan and write our own sea themed poems. In History, we have been learning all about the types of entertainment you could find at the seaside in the past. We used a picture of a penny lick as a stimulus and investigated what it was. We were all shocked and surprised to find out it was a reusable ice cream glass. In Design and Technology, we have started planning our designs for our Punch and Judy themed puppets. We look forward to using our stitching techniques to make these!

YEAR THREE:

We began the week with a new focus in the English lessons – non-chronological reports. The children explored the meaning of 'non' and 'chronological' and then linked this to non-fiction and information texts. They participated in a quiz where they had to guess what the focus of the text was – and they were very good! Mid-week, the maths focus on perimeter was completed, and we now move back onto fractions, where we will explore fractions involving more than 1 (whole) – tricky! In science, we continue to observe what happens to plants when denied light, as well as what happens to a plant when the leaves are cut off one side. The plant denied light offered no real surprises, as many of the children had predicted it would become unhealthy, wilt and die. However, the plant with the leaves removed did surprise us, as the leaves grew back again, while the plant continued to thrive! The Lake District continues to be Year 3's learning focus in the geography lesson – with the impacts of tourism, both positive and negative, being discussed. We finished the week with the introduction to the final design and technology brief – to use computer-aided design (CAD) to plan and make a biodegradable plant pot – more about this next week!

YEAR FOUR:

In English lessons, Year 4 have planned and written their own Brer Rabbit story using ideas from the various tales we have explored. The stories were so enjoyable to read! Maths lessons have focused on classifying triangles and quadrilaterals and finding lines of symmetry. We have learnt some tricky mathematical language this week!

On Monday, we used laptops to research a range of Ancient Egyptian pharaohs and created a fact booklet about them. We are thoroughly enjoying our History unit this half term.

In Science, we investigated to find out the best material to muffle sound. We used a decibel reader to record how loud or quiet the alarm sound was, when covered in different materials! Our results surprised us.

Finally, we have enjoyed some 'Journey in Love' lessons as part of our RSE program. We explored how to celebrate, appreciate and respect our differences and we had a really deep discussion about how our actions can impact on society. We created golden rules for a harmonious world and we all shared the qualities that we love about ourselves and our peers! There really is a lot to celebrate in Year 4! We are all unique and wonderful individuals.

YEAR FIVE:

This week in English, Year 5 have finished their balanced arguments about screen use and the effect it has on well-being. We have had many interesting conversations and discovered some eye-opening data! In Maths we have been calculating the perimeter of polygons and splitting different shapes up to find out their area. In History, we looked at Ancient Greece, what family life was like, the clothes they wore, the toys they had and what education was like during this time. We then thought about how this compares to our lives today. In RE, we revisited the Sacrament of Reconciliation and created booklets for non-Catholics to describe what happens, giving reasons for the religious words, actions and symbols used. In Science, we completed our Animals including Humans topic by doing a growth survey. We looked at how arm span changes as we get older. Another busy week! We can't believe there are only two left to go!

YEAR SIX:

A big congratulations to our wonderful Year 6's who performed their hearts out twice this week. All their hard work and determination certainly paid off. In our history topic 'Events that shaped Liverpool,' we looked at the cause and effect of the Toxteth Riots and the Dockers' scandal. We had mature conversations and could only imagine what the people of Liverpool were going through on these separate events. Acrylic paints were the medium of choice this week and we practised painting the Liver building ahead of next week's final piece.
