WHAT'S BEEN HAPPENING IN SCHOOL THIS WEEK?

EYFS:

Reception have had another busy and exciting week as we approach the end of term. They demonstrated how mature they have become as they watched the Year 6 end of year performance, and the whole school talent show. They were a fantastic audience and thoroughly enjoyed watching all of SPB's Got Talent! A big well done to our Reception performers as well! We have also been busy this week preparing for carnival on Friday. The children have learned all about Brazil, Rio and Carnival and have designed their own costumes and masks, adding feathers and sparkles to their final piece! We finished off the week with our special carnival day, and re-enacted a special airport trip to Brazil! We had a special visitor who came and told us all about her job as cabin crew, and demonstrated what it's like to work onboard an airplane! We finished our day with a carnival party and the children showed off their Samba dancing! Well done Reception!

YEAR ONE:

This week, we have been busy finishing off lots of our different curriculum topics. In maths, we have explored capacity and mass. We used different containers and we had to estimate and measure how many cups of water would fill each container. We then used balancing scales to estimate and measure how many cubes weighed equal to a range of different objects. We had some excellent estimating skills! In English, we have explored Robot poetry. We listened to a poem and then we wrote our own in pairs. We then got to perform them to our classmates! In Art, we used a range of recyclable materials to make robots. We had to draw our designs first before we created them. We hope you loved them as much as we did! The highlight of our week was watching the talent show. We loved cheering on our year 1 acts and also seeing how much amazing talent we have in our school. It was a very enjoyable start to our Wednesday. We are really looking forward to all the exciting things we are going to be doing during our final few days of Year 1.

YEAR TWO:

We have had another brilliant week in school! The children have continued to work hard and have enjoyed their last full week in Year 2. In English we have been practicing our SPaG using conjunctions and connectives. In Maths we have continued to revise what we have learnt completing our end of year reviews. In RE we have continued learning about treasures, revisiting what we learnt at the start of the year with the creation story and thinking about God's treasures that he created for us. In History we concluded our learning about the seaside, then and now. We discussed what we have learnt over the last few weeks then sorted pictures into categories; past, present and both. In DT we had lots of fun finishing our puppets! We then drew our final product in our DT booklets. We have also had an extra Spanish lesson this week to conclude our learning for this year.

We had a wonderful morning on Wednesday watching our school talent show, SPB's Got Talent! We were wowed with all kinds of talents from singing, gymnastics and instruments to break dancing! We voted for our winner and this was announced in assembly on Friday. Well done to all the children that took part, you were all amazing! No homework this week, TTRockstars and Spelling Shed are still available if you would like to continue with those. We will be having some show and tell during our RE lesson on Monday, please could the children bring a 'treasure' to show. This could be a photograph, a special book or a special teddy for example. Also, we have collected in all reading books now so if you still have any at home please send them to school on Monday.
