

Rights Ambassador Team

The Rights Ambassadors first formed in January 2016 when St Paschal Baylon started its UNICEF Rights Respecting Schools journey. At first, our meetings were held after school; however, as our journey progressed we changed our meetings to Thursday lunch times, which continues to this day.



Our main aim has always been to '*get the message out there*' about children's rights (in accordance with the **Convention on the Rights of the Child**). Over time we have: held competitions, had information stands at Summer and Christmas fayres, created our very own rights mascot (Ruby Rights), performed in assemblies, created a half-termly newsletter and visited a local secondary school where we designed and created our own Ambassador badges with the help of the Design and Technology team there.

We have also created a school banner, been invited by Incredible Edibles to add items to a time capsule, visited the store Iceland as part of their 'No Palm Oil' drive, set up a 'One Paper Towel' challenge to encourage reduced use of paper towels and participated in Liverpool City Council's Child Friendly City project!

A regular task of the team is to choose the '*Article of the Month*' which is always carefully deliberated over and chosen to compliment events or the numerous '*World Days*' which are usually highlighted through class activities or assemblies.
