WHAT'S BEEN HAPPENING IN SCHOOL THIS WEEK?

EYFS:

This week we have continued with our 'Holidays' topic. We have been packing suitcases in the home corner and writing lists of things to pack for a summer holiday. We turned our water tray into the Great Barrier Reef and learned a little more about it. In the creative area, we have used watercolour paints to create ocean landscapes. On Wednesday, we spent the morning in Year One with our new teachers. We had lots of fun art playing in their outdoor area and produced some lovely art work for our new classrooms! In maths, we have explored data. We looked at how data is recorded in pictograms and tally charts. We collected our own data to find out our favourite pets. In Elmer class, the favourite pet was a rabbit and in Gruffalo class, the favourite pet was a dog! Homework this week is all about interpreting data too. In RE, we continued to look at friends of Jesus. We have learned more about saints and listened to the stories of St Peter and St Paul. Finally, we spent some time with the chicks before we said our goodbyes and they went back to the farm. We hope you have a lovely weekend. We can't believe that there are only two weeks of Reception left!

YEAR ONE:

Our final weeks of Year One are flying by and this week has been an exciting one. We have been revisiting instructional writing this week focused on our story 'The Last Wolf'. We have been preparing to write a recipe for a bear cake - next week we will structure our writing. In Maths, we have explored money and have learnt all about the coins and notes we use in the United Kingdom. We completed a science investigation this week. We were testing materials to see which one would be better for a tent- Little Red and her friends wanted to go on a camping trip. We needed the material to be waterproof, flexible and opaque! We found nylon to be the best material and sponge to be the worst! On Wednesday, we thoroughly enjoyed our morning in Year 2. We got to meet our new teachers and do some fun activities in our new classroom. On Thursday, we held our talent show auditions. The talents of all the children who auditioned were incredible and we were so impressed with their confidence. We are very excited for the actual talent show in the last week of term!

YEAR TWO:

We have had a lovely week in Year 2 and we can't believe we only have another 2 weeks together! On Monday, we had a parcel arrive in class full of gadgets to make a new invention; a flying machine! We have started to think about different inventions that we could design and we will be writing an explanation text on how to use it. In Maths we have been applying all of our learning from this year to some word problems. Please help us to practise this for our homework this week. In R.E. we had a lovely lesson learning about Fratelli Tutti: Pope Francis' letter urging us all to build a better world. We made pledges to be a good global neighbour including things such as donating to food banks, looking after our environment and making efforts to help stop pollution. In our History lesson this week we looked at what people would take on a picnic to the beach in Victorian times. We planned our collage in Art, ready to make in our next lesson. We had a fantastic morning on Wednesday when we visited our new Year 3 classrooms with our new teachers. We found out some of the exciting things we will be learning next year including: The Stone Age in History, Volcanoes in Geography and we even learnt some new moves for the 3 x tables song! On Friday morning the children got to showcase their many talents in our talent show auditions! We were blown away by the variety of talent in our year group and their confident performances. Each class voted for their favourite act and these will go through to the whole school St Paschal Baylon's got Talent finals! Well done everyone!

YEAR THREE:

It has been a very exciting week for Year 3! We started off the week with Mass, which celebrated Year 4's First Holy Communion. On Monday afternoon, Mr Sunter's class began to compose a piece of music with the notes 'C, A and G', which was linked to the song 'Bringing Us Together'; whilst Mrs Ashton's class completed a 'scavenger hunt' during the computing lesson, to see what our school network looks like. Both classes then 'swapped over' on Tuesday afternoon, to complete the aforementioned activities. Many of the children showcased their talents during the talent show auditions on Thursday - they should all be very proud of their efforts! Wednesday was probably the highlight of the week, when Year 3 became Year 4 for the morning! The children came back in good spirits and with big smiles on their faces, so we hope they went home very positive and are looking forward to the next year of their primary school journey.

YEAR FOUR:

What an exciting week we've had in Year 4!

On Monday, the children celebrated their First Holy Communion, with our school community, in a special mass with Fr. Colin; showed off their dance moves in a funky disco and even enjoyed watching a film with popcorn. What a fantastic day!

On Wednesday, the children were very excited to spend the morning in Year 5. They were all eager to share their experience when they returned to Year 4. It is obvious the children are all really looking forward to the next academic year!

On Friday, we had an action-packed day at Speke Hall. The children had so much fun exploring the grounds and walking around the Tudor manor. They discovered lots of interesting facts about Richard Watt.

We also found the time to complete our Geometry chapter in Maths and explore the vocabulary in a biography about Sir David Attenborough in English.

YEAR FIVE:

This week in RE, Year 5 read some scripture from the book of Psalms and learned about how humans are called to stewardship of God's creation. We decided if some statements were good or bad examples of stewardship and gave reasons for our choices. In History, we learnt about famous ancient Greeks, their achievements and how they influenced the world. In English, we began Outcome 2 of our King Kong topic. We will be writing balanced arguments so have been gathering information about keeping gorillas in captivity and have debated the positives and negatives of doing so. In Maths, we have been completing the 'End of Year Revision' questions at the end of our workbook to see which concepts we need more practice of before moving into Year 6. In RSHE this week, we looked at human social, emotional and physical development from birth to adolescence. We really enjoyed sharing stories of toddler tantrums! One of the highlights of the week was practising sewing different stitches ahead of beginning to make our bags in D&T next week. We got a bit tangled up at times but we learnt how to fix our mistakes quite quickly and have made good progress with it. Hopefully there won't be any holes in our bags which things can fall out of!

YEAR SIX:

Year 6 have visited our new schools this week and we shared some of the varied experiences that we had. We also wrote personalised letters to our Year 5's to share with them what they could expect in September. There were loads of positive messages and encouragement proving that our Year 6's have thoroughly enjoyed their time here and want our Year 5's to have the same experience. In History, we studied how the 'dockers scandal' and how these events shaped Liverpool and how the world reacted. The injustice suffered by many families in Liverpool was clearly displayed in our writing. We then went on to study how the Beatles impacted Liverpool and made the city a tourist attraction with a lasting legacy. In PSHE we looked at how we can protect ourselves from identity theft by using secure passwords that include upper and lower case, symbols and numbers. By updating these passwords every six months adds extra security too. Finally, in ICT, we made a start to design our own web page which included images, text and hyperlinks to other pages.
