WHAT'S BEEN HAPPENING IN SCHOOL THIS WEEK?

EYFS:

It has been a very different week than usual. On Monday, Gruffalo class enjoyed a drama and music workshop led by The B Tales Christian Theatre Company. The children had lots of fun bringing Bible stories to life using bubbles, props, dress up and a parachute! Elmer class will enjoy the workshop next week! Then on Thursday, we had a great time during our trip to Farmer Teds. We learned about various animals, went on a tractor ride, groomed Shetland ponies and watched a sheep show! The children were so enthusiastic and well behaved during the trip and were a credit to our school! On Friday, we had a fantastic day to celebrate 50 years of St Paschal Baylon! We enjoyed activities, playing some games, dancing and we showcased our bonnets in the bonnet parade. In Maths, we have continued to explore money whilst in Topic, we have continued to explore Holidays. We have also enjoyed spending time in the sunshine, playing in outdoor area. Finally, at the end of the week, our eggs hatched and we have 5 fluffy chicks. The children have shared their knowledge of the hatching process. Can they tell you how the chicks get out of their shells? The children have loved holding the chicks and have even named them! Our chicks will now go back to the farm. Have a great weekend everyone!

YEAR ONE:

This week, we have completed our hunting narrative based around 'The Lost Wolf.' We have definitely shown that our writing skills are more than ready for Year 2. In Maths, we have continued to explore telling the time. We have practised o'clock and half past and we have been learning how to navigate a calendar. There is some more practise of telling the time for homework. Our PSHE lesson this week was all about biodegradable and non-biodegradable products. We discussed the importance of recycling and we explored how long items can take to decompose in the environment. This linked nicely to our Art project of making junk model robots - we utilised lots of recyclable materials to help us make these. It was so much fun! In Science, we continued with our work on 'Materials and their Properties' by completing an 'odd one out' activity. We had to identify objects that were the odd one out and explain why using our knowledge of the different materials. We were excellent at this! Finally, we had the best day celebrating SPB's 50th birthday on Friday. We enjoyed sharing our excellent hats, we created birthday cards and enjoyed a lolly ice with our friends! We hope you all enjoyed the fayre!

YEAR TWO:

It has been a busy week in Year 2! We have completed our narrative writing in English about our own character designing a new invention just like Rosie Revere! In Maths, we have been learning how to measure volume in litres and millilitres by reading amounts on different containers. In History this week we learnt about the clothing that Victorian people might have worn at the Seaside. We then compared this with what we might wear. In Art, we continued to practise different collage techniques in preparation for making our own Seaside collages in the style of Jayne Huskisson. We carried out an investigation in Science on Thursday to see if we could change the shape of different objects by bending, squashing, stretching and twisting. We had a fabulous day on Friday celebrating 50 years of our wonderful school! Next week, we will be holding Year 2 auditions for our school talent show. If children have a talent that they would like to showcase they can share this with us next Friday morning.

YEAR THREE:

The end may be nearing, but the week was a busy and productive one, as usual! In geography, the focus was on the Lake District and it was lovely to see how much knowledge some of the children already had on the area. Through using maps, both classes were able to identify some of the physical features of the Lake District and began to look at the human aspects, particularly tourism and how it affects its economy. Computer Aided Design (CAD) was explored in the computing lesson: the children's task was to create a cylindrical shape, and hollow it out, in order to create a plant pot design in readiness to produce a biodegradable plant pot out of newspaper. And in R.E., the classes considered 'conscience' and the Sacrament of Reconciliation, which they will revisit in more detail in Year 4, as they prepare for First Holy Communion. The week ended in high excitement, with the celebration of St Paschal Baylon's 50th year! Thank you to all the children and families who put in lots of effort, in order to make bonnets for the parade, as well as getting creative with outfits and uniforms – it was lovely to see the children parading around proudly and having fun! Year 3 would also like to send a big '*thank you*' to all the PTA and support staff, who put in huge amounts of effort to arrange the special celebration.

YEAR FOUR:

Another week flies by in the blink of an eye in Year 4!

In English, our pupils have been busy creating their own writing inspired by the story 'Manfish.' They have written as a young Jacques Costeau, documenting his dreams of creating an invention that would enable him to breathe underwater.

We started learning about symmetry in maths, using mirrors to create shapes that reflect across the mirror line.

On Thursday, we used different instruments to experiment with pitch. Children were provided with a recorder, glockenspiel and guitar and tasked with finding ways of making low and high pitched sounds.

To conclude the week, we have celebrated the 50th birthday of the school with a number of fun activities and our bonnet parade!

YEAR FIVE:

In RE this week, Year 5 have been learning about the impacts of climate change and how CAFOD is helping communities throughout the world to adapt and prepare. We did a quiz and learnt some really interesting facts. In Maths lessons, we learnt the Roman Numerals up to M=1000 and used this knowledge to work out different things such as when television programmes were produced and the years we were born. In English, we began writing our dilemma narratives involving two contrasting characters. We have been using a range of grammar features to blend action, description and dialogue. In History, we watched a video and learnt about what life used to be like in Athens and Sparta and decided where we would have preferred to live, weighing up the pros and cons of each. One of the most enjoyable parts of the week was the Year 5 talent show. We had a range of talents from piano playing to dancing. It was wonderful to see our children performing and we are looking forward to the KS2 final!

YEAR SIX:

Year 6 have learned about a local charity in R.E. this week who provide for the homeless in our city. We understood the importance of donating and spending money which later goes to a charitable cause. In maths we revisited co-ordinates which also included algebra as co-ordinates. In Art, we began our oil pastel work of our beach scene inspired by L.S. Lowry. We will look forward to completing these next week. In Science we studied the direction and length of a shadow from 9am to 3pm and used our scientific knowledge to explain the results. And on Friday we had a fun-filled day learning about the history of our school and the songs of the decades that previous children in our school may have listened to.
