WHAT'S BEEN HAPPENING IN SCHOOL THIS WEEK?

EYFS:

This week, we continued our 'Holidays' topic. We enjoyed sharing our holiday experiences and talking about our favourite memories. This inspired us to write our own postcards. Building on our understanding of hot and cold places, we discussed what we might need and wear on a summer holiday. Using this knowledge, we then practised our cutting and sticking skills to create our own summer holiday outfits. In numeracy, we have been learning about money. We used coins to make different amounts and set up an ice cream shop where the children had fun role-playing—buying ice creams, making totals, and even giving change! In construction, we used Lego to design and build different modes of transport we might use to go on holiday, including cars, boats, and aeroplanes. In the creative area, we explored watercolours and block oil pastels to create beautiful pictures of undersea creatures. Finally, in RE, we continued learning about Saint Peter and Saint Paul, who were friends of Jesus. It's been another busy and exciting week. We're really looking forward to next week when we'll spend a day in Year One, meet our new teachers—and enjoy Spanish Fiesta Day! Have a great weekend!

YEAR ONE:

We've had a lovely week in Year One! In English, we have been planning and writing our versions of The Last Wolf! We are definitely showing that we are almost ready for Year 2 with how excellent our work has been. In Maths, we have continued exploring time. We have been understanding the difference between seconds, minutes and hours and identifying appropriate timescales for a range of activities. We have also been learning how to read calendars and understand the passage of days and weeks. We've really enjoyed it! In DT we have begun preparing to make bug hotels and the children have been tasked with gathering the materials they will need to build one next week. In history, we explored the significant impact Kitty Wilkinson has had on our lives today and we linked this to how important hygiene was during the COVID pandemic! Crazy that our Year Ones were babies back then. On Thursday, we had so much fun doing our Talent Show auditions. We can't believe the talent we have in our year group. We are so excited to see all the acts in the show in a couple of weeks' time. Have a lovely weekend!

YEAR TWO:

This week in Year 2, we've been super busy and very creative! In English, we wrote our very own invention narratives inspired by *Rosie Revere, Engineer*. The children came up with some brilliant, imaginative inventions – from flying shoes to homework robots! In DT we got stuck into making our own hand puppets. The children learned how to sew and had so much fun designing and stitching their characters. In history, we travelled back in time to explore seaside holidays in the Victorian era. We compared them with seaside trips we enjoy today and spotted lots of differences – no ice cream vans back then! It's been a week full of creativity, curiosity, and lots of learning. Well done, Year2!

YEAR THREE:

Year 3 have had a lovely week of learning and fun! On Monday, in RE, the children learnt about the Jewish celebration of Passover and specifically, the Seder Plate. They learnt about the six items that are on the plate and the significance of each. In English, they have analysed the structural and language features of a 'Lost Narrative' and have begun to gather ideas to plan their own version. They used role play to act out a boy becoming lost in the forest and were able to describe the setting as well as the character's feelings and emotions. In Maths, the children have started a new chapter on 'Perimeter'. They have done an excellent job so far of calculating the length of shapes by measuring each side and finding the total. In Geography, we have been learning about different counties and the regions that we live in. In DT, the children will be designing and making a biodegradable plant pot. This week, they researched ideas and began to sketch their own design. Thursday was an exciting afternoon when we held our annual year group talent show. The array of talent on show was impressive and it was a thoroughly enjoyable afternoon for those participating as well as those spectating! Well done to all Year 3!

YEAR FOUR:

This week in Maths, Year 4 have continued developing their understanding of perimeter and area. To calculate perimeter, pupils practised counting the units around the outside of a shape, while for area, they learned how to multiply the length by the width to find out how many square units fit inside a shape. It's been great to see their confidence growing as they apply these skills to different problems.

In English, we have been writing diary entries from the perspective of Mahek, a character in our class text *The Journey*. Pupils have captured her emotions and experiences as she flees her home with her children, focusing on writing in the first person to explore her thoughts and feelings during these difficult events. The writing has been powerful and empathetic, demonstrating great maturity.

Our new History topic—Ancient Egypt—got off to an exciting start this week. We learned about the River Nile and discussed why it was so important to the development of Ancient Egyptian civilisation. Pupils were fascinated to learn how the river supported farming, transport, and trade.

In Computing on Thursday, we explored the lassoing tool and how it can be used to edit images by selecting and isolating specific parts of a picture. The children enjoyed experimenting with the tool and seeing how it can enhance digital artwork.

Well done to Year 4 for another fantastic week of learning!

YEAR FIVE:

This week in RE, Year 5 discussed a quote by Edmund Burke which states that, 'All that is necessary for the triumph of evil is that good men do nothing.' We debated this issue then explored what we would do in different scenarios at home, in school, in the community and online. In English lessons, we have written five-part dilemma narratives based on our vehicle text, King Kong. We also began looking at a balanced argument based on whether or not dolphins should be kept in captivity and did some online research to gather ideas for our own about gorillas. In Maths, we finished our chapter on Area and Perimeter, managing some very challenging composite shapes, which we had to break up before calculating the length multiplied by the breadth, and some irregular shapes which only partially filled the squares on the grid. In Computing, we continued our work on vector drawings designing our own using a range of learnt skills and trying to recreate other given images. In History, we focused on how Ancient Greece influenced the world, studying six famous people from the past including Aristotle and Socrates. Our favourite part of the week was our talent show auditions. We enjoyed a range of talent and were blown away by the quality of the performances. We are really looking forward to the grand final now!

YEAR SIX:

This week, as part of our recent 'History of Liverpool topic' and music enrichment, we joined a live Zoom session titled *Beatlemania*, celebrating the legacy of The Beatles and exploring their impact on music and culture. In art, we continued preparing for our seaside-themed final pieces, practising oil pastel techniques and experimenting with colour blending to create depth and atmosphere. During our RE lesson, we explored Judaism as part of our 'Other Faiths' topic, learning about Rosh Hashanah and the symbolism behind traditional foods – we even had the chance to taste apples dipped in honey to reflect on hopes for a sweet new year. On Thursday, we also took part in a live transition session with other schools, designed to support and prepare us for the exciting journey ahead into Year 7! Next week, we are excited to be visiting our secondary schools for the day. Our teachers are confident that we will make a fantastic impression, as always.
