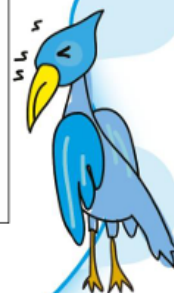

WHAT'S BEEN HAPPENING IN SCHOOL THIS WEEK?

EYFS:

It's been an exciting and busy week! We started by spending a morning with our new Year One teachers, engaging in fun activities and getting familiar with our new classrooms. We also celebrated our first Spanish Fiesta Day, where we dressed in the colours and traditional attire of Spain! We learned a flamenco dance, explored Peruvian musical instruments, and enjoyed Spanish-themed parachute games. In maths, we continued our learning about money, with a focus on giving change. We practiced using subtraction to calculate change and then demonstrated our understanding by showing the correct amount using coins. In music, we sang nursery rhymes and explored the concept of pulse by using different musical instruments. We have also worked on reading captions, matching them with drawings to show our comprehension. Additionally, we took time to reflect on our time in Reception, writing and drawing about our favourite moments from the year. We are looking forward to the SPB's Got Talent show in our penultimate week of Reception! Have a great weekend everyone!

YEAR ONE:

It has been a busy week in year 1. In Maths we have been learning and recognising the coins and notes we use in the UK. In English, we have been looking at recipes, and learnt how to use imperative verbs in sentences. We learnt about the cross as a symbol of Christianity in RE, and made our own class crosses to represent our school values. In DT we built some amazing Bug Hotels, using recycled materials. They are now out in the garden, waiting for some creepy crawly customers to arrive! We also celebrated Spanish Fiesta Day! We learnt about Latin American music, danced some Salsa and played handball. It is so lovely to celebrate another culture as a whole class.

YEAR TWO:

Hello everyone! We've had a super fun and busy week in Year 2! The children were fantastic on Transition Day, showing confidence and excitement as they met their new Year 3 teachers and explored their future classrooms. Fiesta Day was a big hit too – with tombola, music, dancing, and lots of smiles all round! A huge thank you to everyone who donated goods and helped make the day so special. In music, we've been learning *The Friendship Song* through Charanga, and the children are loving it – we've heard some amazing singing and teamwork. Don't forget: PE kits on Wednesday, reading books in by Thursday, and please send in a water bottle and sun hat if it's sunny. Have a lovely weekend!

YEAR THREE:

It's been a fantastic week in Year 3, packed with exciting learning and new experiences! In English, the children have now finished planning their 'Lost Narrative' and have begun writing the first two paragraphs. The children have impressed us with their use of descriptive language and creative ideas – we're looking forward to seeing how their stories unfold. In maths, we've continued our work on perimeter, focusing on calculating the perimeter of shapes using centimetres. Both classes are becoming more confident in measuring and applying their understanding to solve real-world problems. Our geography lesson this week took us on a journey from Liverpool to the Lake District! We enjoyed plotting the route on a map, identifying motorways, key cities, and natural landmarks such as Helvellyn and Scafell Pike along the way. On Wednesday, Year 3 had a taste of what's to come as they took part in a transition morning in Year 4. It was a great opportunity for them to experience the next step in their learning journey! In science, we explored the meanings of opaque, translucent, and transparent, with the children identifying which objects around the classroom allow all light to pass through, some light to pass through or no light at all! The highlight of the week was undoubtedly Spanish Fiesta Day on Friday. From learning to Salsa dance and trying out handball, to enjoying a Spanish lesson and watching a live Latin American music performance (complete with traditional clothing), the children had a brilliant time celebrating Spanish culture.

YEAR FOUR:

This week, in English, Year 4 have dived into poetry — quite literally! Our focus has been on writing descriptive poems all about the sea. The children have used their senses to create powerful imagery, capturing the sound of crashing waves and the mystery of the deep. We have been so impressed with the high-level vocabulary the children have used. In Maths, we have been exploring different types of angles — acute, obtuse and right angles. We also investigated different types of triangles, including equilateral, isosceles and scalene, learning how to spot the differences between them. In History, we travelled back in time to Ancient Egypt to learn all about how the pyramids were built. The children were fascinated by the scale and effort involved in constructing these ancient wonders. To bring history to life, the children wrote diary entries in role as Nakht (a famous writer from this time). The children were very excited to visit Year 5 on Wednesday morning, and they are certainly ready to make this transition into Upper Key Stage 2. Finally, on Friday, we celebrated Fiesta Day. We had so much fun learning how to Salsa; listening to some Latin American music; playing Handball and learning some new Spanish vocabulary.

YEAR FIVE:

This week in RE, Year 5 talked about people, places and things on Earth that we care about. We read a Sanskrit poem and created leaves with our thoughts for a display. In English this week, we used laptops to gather ideas for our balanced arguments about gorillas in captivity, focusing on the positives and negatives of them. We also learnt about a gorilla called Pablo and his story. We practised writing some debate sentences in preparation for our own pieces. In Maths we have completed our volume chapter, multiplying the length by the breadth and the height. We also solved word problems involving figuring out one of the dimensions when given the volume. In PSHE we talked about friendships and how they can change. We generated lots of words associated with being a good friend and created graffiti walls. In History, we looked at how Ancient Greece has influenced the modern day world and wrote our names in Greek. The highlight of the week was our trip to Crosby Beach to study the Antony Gormley statues. We enjoyed sketching them and creating sand models of humans and sea creatures. We demonstrated excellent artistic skills but also brilliant teamwork. What a great day!

YEAR SIX:

We began the week with transition days at our new secondary schools, where children had the opportunity to explore their future learning environments, meet new teachers, and take part in fun, engaging activities that helped ease any nerves and build excitement for the year ahead. On Friday, we immersed ourselves in Spanish Fiesta Day, celebrating Spanish and Latin American culture through music, dance, and language-based activities. The children particularly enjoyed learning some lively salsa dance moves and trying on colourful Latin American-inspired costumes, which brought the festivities to life! In RE, we have continued our learning about the sacraments, with a particular focus this week on the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick. We explored the key signs and symbols associated with this sacrament, such as holy oil, prayers, and the laying on of hands, and reflected on the importance of compassion, comfort, and spiritual healing.
